- Chairman's Remarks







John Carbonell called the meeting to order and provided opening remarks. Reminder that due to Due to the Town's, County's and State's declaration of emergency due to COVID-19, the meeting tonight is being conducted remotely. John reminded everyone that the meeting will be broadcast on Facebook and archived and reminded everyone about upcoming virtual town meetings where the Plan will be reviewed.

Draft Plan Overview

- Jake gave overview of draft plan
- Discussed concurrency on nodal development
 - i. Small-scale development specified in most nodes
 - ii. Some development could build parts of roadways,
 - iii. Town has TIA and it is recommended to be refined to keep infrastructure up with growth

• Public Engagement Update

- Review of survey respones
 - i. 250 survey responses to date
- Demographic representation
 - i. 80% White on this survey, more diverse than previous surveys
 - ii. Lower income hard to get to take surveys. 6%

Potential Revisions

- Discussed concern over specificity of some recommendations
 - i. For example, the recommendation for a full-time fire department, where did that come from?
 - A: It is not a rec for full time department, but one or more full-time leadership positions. This comes from stakeholder interviews.
 - 2. We may want to be more generic about budget priorities and land banking for fire and police services.
- May include a disclaimer that recommendations are based on a number of sources, including stakeholders, steering committee, and community input.
- Question: Does the FLU map change our zoning code?







- i. No not immediately. But it should be used to influence zoning decisions, design, and development approvals.
- Question: What happens with the Small Area Plans? Are they still applicable?
 - i. They are still valid. A lot of detail that is not in the Comp Plan. Many may need to be updated though as they are growing outdated.
- Jennifer Davis gave her feedback:
 - i. Likes that it mimics and builds on 2030, which is used at every meeting.
 - ii. Did not like to hear about subcommittees or direction
 - iii. Would prefer that things are worked out, re: senior housing before plan approval
 - iv. What will happen with recommendations that require a text amendment?
 - 1. A: Priority goals and recs assigned to department with timeline in action plan. This is going to be in the final plan. There will be a number of action items. Staff will work with managers office and town board on how to achieve text amendments, programs, projects, etc.
 - v. May have at time when planning board will have to exercise authority to interpret a decision based on the future plan before it is formally adopted.
- Derek: Would like to see more formal recreation mentioned in the plan like pickleball courts. These features also provide a social element to the Town.
 - i. A: The 2040 Plan can incorporate some programming recommendations, but some of this will be detailed in the Parks and Recreation Master Plan.

 - iii. George Solomon: impressed with process of it all. Reflects positively what we worked on for the year.

 - v. Kim likes level of detail. Will take a while for the PB to absorb.
 - vi. Erin needs more time to reflect on survey answers. Steering Committee will provide full comments after the survey is closed.
