

This represents 2,873 engagements, which is a 25% response rate to our outreach over the past 30 days. These numbers reflect people who have taken specific action to engage, follow or participate in the Huntersville 2040 Community Plan. Since a person may engage in multiple ways, these numbers do not reflect 'unique' individuals.

Survey Response Distribution

The map below shows the distribution of survey responses answering the question, "Where do you live, work, or most closely related to Huntersville?" This may be useful in determining if certain geographic areas need more outreach than others. We also have the ability to look at other demographic data to see if certain age or minority groups are not well-represented.
